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<b>EQUIREMENT 7 F:</b> Prepare a two- to three-page display involving stamps. Using ingenuity, as well as clippings, rawings, etc., tell a story about the stamps and how they relate to history, geography, or a favorite topic of yours.
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<b>REQUIREMENT 8 C:</b> A collection of 100 or more different stamps from either one country or a group of closely related countries.
